

**REQUIREMENTS FOR ARTICLES
INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF STUDENTS' SCIENCE AND ART WORKS
LIEPAJA (LATVIA), February 24-25, 2011**

Language

Scientific articles should be written in the Lithuanian, Latvian or English languages.

Summary – in the English language.

Presentation of the article should be prepared using Microsoft Power Point programme. The presentation should be in the English language.

Summary

In the summary, (10 pt fount, 0,5 of A4 page, 1500 symbols) the discussed problem and the main theses is briefly presented.

Presentation of the article

Presentation of the article is prepared with Microsoft Power Point programme using Times New Roman fount (18 pt). Heading is in 32 fount.

Submission of the article

Text of the article is typed in one column on A4 format page. Margins 2 x 2 x 2 x 2 cm. Fount – Times New Roman. The length of the article – 3 pages. If work is prepared by two people – 5–6 pages. Text of the article is written in Times New Roman, 11 pt, Normal. Summary – 0,5 of page – in 10 pt (fount). Electronic version of the article should be sent to gintare.k@cr.su.lt.

Bibliography

Bibliographical list of literary sources are presented in the original language of sources. First of all, sources are presented according to alphabet – Lithuanian, English, German, French and only then Russian. When quoting, author is mentioned and in brackets – year of literary source publication, for example: J. Petraitis (2003). Participants in the articles should not include in the list authors' works that were not used or quoted in the article. Bibliography list is composed following these instructions:

- For conference material – surname of the author, name initials, year of publication, pages of the article, place of publication and publishing house, for example: Petraitis J., 1991, Bendrieji teksto teorijos klausimai. *Tekstų analizė: Tarptautinės konferencijos medžiaga*. P. 12–15. Šiauliai: Titnagas.
- For the Internet addresses – participants indicate title of the source and full address in order to find text that is being quoted, e.g. Socialinių įgūdžių ugdymas. www.google.lt/.....
